Welcome back to school! We hope you had a restful half term and the children are looking forward to their final half term of primary school.

<p><b>English</b></p> <p>We will be continuing to use Holes as our text driver this term. Inspired by the novel, the children will write for a range of purposes and audiences, producing a variety of written outcomes that showcase their creativity, technical skills, and understanding of different writing styles.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b></p> <p>In Maths, we will be applying our problem-solving skills to a range of open-ended, real-life challenges. The children will design their own theme park, calculating running and entrance costs while working within a given budget and design brief. We will also explore future careers by investigating salaries, budgeting, and calculating everyday expenditure.</p>	<p><b>Learning for Life</b></p> <p>Our topic this term focuses on developing important life skills. The children will explore sewing, resilience, and perseverance, helping them to build confidence, independence, and practical skills for the future. We will also be taking part in a range of transition activities designed to support and prepare the children for their move to secondary school.</p>
<p><b>Windmill Hill</b></p> <p>On the 12<sup>th</sup> June, children will be visiting Windmill Hill for our residential. Please check your emails for the PowerPoint that includes the kit list.</p> <p>Those children who are not attending the residential, will take part in fun activities in school with Mrs McNeil and Miss Penny.</p>	<p><b>Science</b></p> <p>In Science, Year 6 will be learning about climate change, exploring its causes and effects on our planet. They will then apply their understanding by creating their own projects to raise awareness of environmental issues and encourage positive action for the future.</p>	<p><b>PSHE</b></p> <p>Our PSHE topic this term is Living in the Wider World. As part of this topic, the children will explore money management and learn about a range of career opportunities. We will also be teaching Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) this half term using the BBC Operation Ouch! resources. Further information about the content and delivery of these lessons will be provided in a separate letter.</p>
<p><b>PE</b></p> <p>Please ensure that your child brings their PE kit to school every day. This term, we will continue to develop our skills through a range of competitive sports and team games.</p>	<p><b>DT</b></p> <p>As part of our Design and Technology (DT) topic this term, the children will be developing their sewing skills. They will begin by evaluating a range of bags before designing and creating their own bag for a chosen target audience.</p>	<p><b>Performance</b></p> <p>This year, the children will be performing The Adventures of Superstan. Every child will have an important role to play, whether through acting, singing, or helping to create the props that will bring the production to life.</p>
